

The Nile Day provides an opportunity for Basin citizens and friends of the Nile to come together to celebrate the benefits of Nile cooperation and to exchange experiences, views and ideas on topical issues related to the cooperative management and development of the common Nile Basin water.

### <u>Nile Day 2021: NBI and NBD Sign a 5 Year</u> <u>Partnership (MOU)</u>

A 5 year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed between NBI and NBD. The MOU was signed during the Nile Day 2021 celebrations. It is effective from 2021 - 2025 and reaffirms the collective responsibility and common goal of both parties to work towards improving the livelihoods of the people of the River Nile Basin.
